# Book Cover Instructions and Suggestions

Your new book cover should have a front cover, back cover, and spine.

Look at a few books to help guide you with recreating a book cover.

## Front Cover

Include the title, author, and illustrator. The title of the book is usually a larger font than the author and illustrator.

Create a picture that show what happens in the book (usually the setting or the characters).

Include a one sentence book review by you.

## Back Cover

Includes a book blurb.

**Book Blurbs are:**

Make the reader want to read the book.

Use persuasion and description to summarize the book.

Make it short and interesting.

Don't tell the ending.

Includes the author's name, book title, and publisher
